The Department of Criminal Justice Training is a non-tuition facility, and all VA Educational Benefits are directly paid to the recruits.

A beneficiary attending the Law Enforcement Basic Training Academy for the approximated 6 months of training and Public Safety Dispatch Academy approximated 1 month will earn approximately that many months of benefit. The amount is determined by a Veterans Affairs processor.

Chapter 31 and Chapter 33 benefits offer differing ways to provide funding for books and supplies.

Chapter 33 will issue a book stipend prior to each term while chapter 31 provides all funding for books and supplies.

Other benefits such as Chapter 30, 35, and 1606 provide no tuition assistance or assistance with books and supplies.

Public Safety Dispatch Academy recruits are required to complete the following: IS-700 An Introduction to the National Incident Management System; IS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100; IS-200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response and CJIS Full Access certificate.
